Advanced Wheelchair Skills Clinic

Presented by Banner Wheelchair Suns Basketball, Banner Health Arizona, and Arizona Spinal Cord Injury Association.

Shorter hospital and rehabilitation stays may not allow enough time to learn important wheelchair skills, as we age we may need to brush-up or learn new skills to remain independent. This lack of wheelchair skill may lead to secondary conditions or isolation because we cannot negotiate the environment. This course will allow you to become more efficient in the use of your wheelchair. Come and join us in some practical advice from those in the know.

This program is divided into four modules:

Transferring:

Chair to Furniture/bed/vehicle; chair to floor/floor to chair.

Managing your environment:

Opening and closing doors; Operating elevators and escalators; Wheelies; Curbs; Ramps and Various terrain; etc.

Bathroom Mobility:

Focus will be on transfers and clothing management in the restroom.

Mechanics of Your Chair:

Making adjustments to and general maintenance of your wheelchair.

Who Can Apply?

Available to individuals meeting at least one of the following criteria:

- Incoming freshman or continuing students ages 18-25, raised through the child welfare system* and having no form of financial support (A person who has experienced time in the child welfare system may have lived in an institution such as a group home, child protection agency, special facility for children, and/or with a foster family).
- College-age youths and adults with physical disabilities*
- Adults 25 years of age or older who have dependents in their household*

What Is the Criteria?

Applicants must meet all of the following criteria:

- Be working toward their first college degree
- Be a U.S. citizen and a resident of Arizona
- Have a family income no higher than 80% (approx. \$41, 250) of the median income for Maricopa County
- Have no more than 24 college-level, degree-applicable credits

Mesa Accepts Section 8 Voucher Applications

Mesa residents needing help paying their rent have some glimmer of hope. In January, Mesa's Housing Authority will start accepting applications from those interested in getting on the waiting list for a rental subsidy voucher program.

The federal program is targeted at low-income families or individuals who need help paying their rent. It compensates for the difference between what a person or family can afford to pay for rent and the actual rent established for a particular living space.

Applications and required documents can be picked up from Mesa's Housing Authority at 415 N. Pasadena starting January 7th. Applications also will be available online. For more information, call 480-644-3536. Applications taken in person Monday-Thursday from 8:00AM til Noon.
